## LGH Foundation ball raises \$600,000

The Lakeshore General Hospital Foundation is pleased to announce that their 14<sup>th</sup> annual Lakeshore Ball, which was held on Saturday, November 1<sup>st</sup>, 2014 at the Pavillion-sur-le-Lac at the lovely Château Vaudreuil, raised \$600,000 toward the purchase of a fetal monitoring system for the Lakeshore General Hospital's Nick Di Tomaso Birthing Centre. The ball was highlighted by the presence of many West Island VIPs and by a generous surprise donation from Broccolini, who thrilled the gathered crowd when Joseph Broccolini announced a \$300,000 donation to the Lakeshore General Hospital Foundation. The event was part of the Lakeshore General Hospital Foundation's 50<sup>th</sup>-anniversary campaign and the evening's theme was 'Be 'Bold, Wear Gold!'
